RABBI'S REFLECTIONS: On Clothes, Candles, and Miracles



The Talmud's story of Hanukkah is well-known: a small oil flask contained enough oil for lighting the Temple menorah for one day, but lasted for the eight days it took to make up a new batch.

The codes rule that lighting Hanukkah candles is so fundamental (Maimonides, Mishneh Torah, Laws of Megillah and Hanukkah 4:12, Shulhan Arukh Orah Hayyim 671:1), that if you don't have the money to buy Hanukkah candles, you must beg for it, or sell the shirt off your back in order to get money to buy them. There is no Talmudic source for this.

Selling the shirt off your back is not taken lightly. In Exodus 22:25-26, the Torah does not allow a creditor to take the clothing a borrower wears as a security or pledge. One cannot sell the shirt off one's back for an etrog, for a mezuzah, or any other positive command, even though they are from Torah. Moreover, lighting Hanukkah candles is Rabbinic. Why the fuss?

There is another mitzvah for which one sells the shirt off one's back: the four cups of Pesah wine. What makes these two mitzvot special is that they: (1) are the only examples of publicizing God's miracles; (2) recognize the good that God does; and (3) engender praise and thanks to God.

Maimonides, who wrote the eight levels of tsedaqah (charity), gives a clue. The tsedaqah list relies on the Talmud's idea of human dignity. Even when things look grim, we still have God-given dignity. Accordingly, we look to combine God and human action to remind us that no matter how bad things seem, there is light at the tunnel's end; redemption after misfortune. These two mitzvot tell us to hope because of our dignity. We also perform them in the midst of community, and in the presence of others. We invite the needy to seder. We publicize the Hanukkah miracle in public while people, even non-Jews, walk the streets. We always hope. My friend Rabbi Joseph Radinsky (z"l) said that Hanukkah "candles stand for the Jewish soul, for our potential. We must never let the lights go out. We must always feel we have the potential and that we can cope with our problems." This is why we sell the shirt off our back for Hanukkah candles.

We emulate the Maccabees, who lit the Temple menorah despite only having enough oil for one day, knowing that it wouldn't last. We hope, for there always is the potential to overcome and solve our problems. We always have the potential to go forward, even when we know that there will be many problems. Hanukkah teaches that miracles may occur, but only happen when we hope and act anyway, in order to forge a path forward.






Leaves on the Tree of Life
