

RABBI'S REFLECTIONS: Try to Understand

Better.com CEO Vishal Garg recently asked 900 employees to join him in a Zoom conference. He announced that they were fired. He received criticism both from within and without the company. Some employees quit, including the heads of communication and marketing. He issued a sort of apology, noting that he hadn't shown

the workers the amount of respect and appreciation that they deserved. In the end, the board announced that he was taking time off effective immediately, and that they were going to going to take steps to build a long-term sustainable and positive culture at Better.com. This wasn't Garg's first instance of lack of people skills at the company. He forgot basic advice, failing to put himself in another's place (see Pirqei Avot 2:4/5), trying to understand a situation before acting.

This advice is epitomized in the following story: A small girl sobbed uncontrollably on a crowded train, disturbing the other passengers as she continued unabated. An older girl with her clearly was unable to manage her. Finally a passenger snapped, "Where's the girl's mother?" "She's in the next car," the older girl replied. "Well, get her." "She can't come." "Why not?" "She's in her coffin." After this exchange, the passengers poured out their concern and sympathy for the little girl. They now understood her feelings.

Are we guilty of behaving similarly? Do we think about how taking time to understand a situation might change what we do? Do we look at our bosses and wonder why they act as they do? Do we try to understand our employees and wonder why they behave as they do? Have we forgotten the lesson of watching, and of having been, children at play?

We should take the time to see if someone is tense, and wonder why. What produces tension in our lives? What relieves it? How would we want others to handle it?

Why do people kill? Commit violence? Especially those who seem to have everything? Maybe they don't, or maybe having everything isn't really having everything? What do they actually lack, for clearly to behave this way they lack something?

Understanding others is not easy. It requires effort. Yet it is the only way to figure out the mystery of other people and how they behave. Will you try to understand? If so, we will make this world better.






