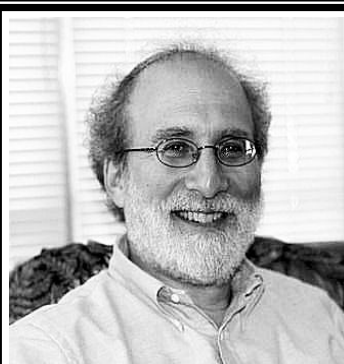

Rabbi Michael Rascoe

A story told of Professor Robert Goheen when he was President of Princeton University: A student failed his entrance exams. Before heading home, he went to see President Goheen, and thanked him because he had learned a great deal at Princeton. An amazed President Goheen replied, "You were never enrolled. What could you possibly have learned here?" The young man said, "How little I know!" Goheen admitted him, claiming, "You are already two years ahead of the freshman class."

When it comes to Universe University, we know next to nothing; a little bit about the atom, subatomic physics, the brain, etc. Even then, it's only in certain small areas. As Niels Bohr said, "An expert is a person who has found out by his own painful experience all the mistakes that one can make in a very narrow field."

About God, we know nothing; yet, we drag God down to our level. God is some extra-large old man

with a long white beard sitting on a throne on a cloud surrounded by winged white angels and cute baby-faced cherubim (people in Biblical times would think we're crazy about this last bit). We look heavenward only when we want something. God is for us, in our lifetimes. Who cares about afterwards; after all, we can't comprehend, let alone think about, eternity, when we aren't even a blip on the screen. We make God our servant, expecting God to do what we want: help our team (not the other one, though they pray for the opposite to happen). When one drop of water contains a teeming world, and the subatomic is its own world, with its own rules, why do we think that we, both us and all of humanity, are the greatest existence, the be-all and end-all?

When one handful of earth has a million possibilities, so do, and so are, we. We used to see the wonder in the world; to be in awe that God created us in the divine image, akin to both animals and angels. We marveled at the miracle of one human life. Now, often at most, we only see it as a baby is born. No matter how much we explain it, life is a mystery beyond comprehension. It is even more true of God. Since our brain has gaps in, and limits to, our knowledge of the universe and life, this and more is true of God. In the end, the Bible tells us two things: The beginning of wisdom is reverence toward God (Psalm 111:10), and You shall be holy, for I, the Eternal, your God, am holy (Leviticus 19:2). Our behavior and values are how we learn and then act to try to imitate God.

Heroic Women in the Hebrew Bible: Miriam, Esther, and Ruth

These three women are among the most heroic characters in the Hebrew Bible. Two of them have books bearing their names, and one has her own cup at the Passover Seder. All three of them teach us about courage, commitment, and hope. I will share highlights of their stories and suggest the contemporary meaning of their experiences.

Rabbi Stephen A. Karol is Rabbi Emeritus of Temple Isaiah in Stony Brook, New York, and the author of **Finding Hope and Faith in the Face of Death: Insights of a Rabbi and Mourner**. He was ordained at the Hebrew Union College-Jewish Institute of Religion (HUC-JIR) in Cincinnati in 1977, and has served at Temple Beth Zion in Buffalo, New York; Congregation Sha'aray Shalom in Hingham, Massachusetts; and Temple Isaiah. He teaches at Temple Isaiah and also at the Osher Lifelong Learning Institute (OLLI) at Stony Brook University. Rabbi Karol lives in Port Jefferson Station, New York, with his wife Donna.

It is a wonderful evening and a great way to begin Shabbat.

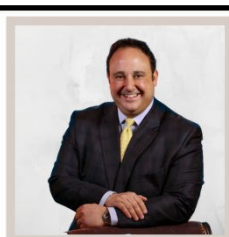

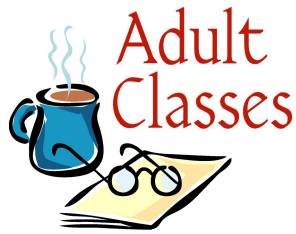

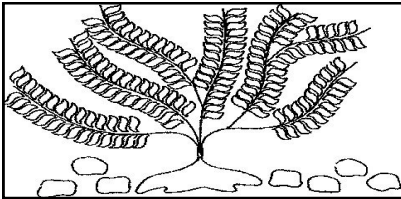
