

RABBI'S REFLECTIONS: The Unforgivable Error

Agatha Christie's detective, Hercule Poirot, (a sequel is due fall 2023) puts down everyone because nobody is in his intellectual league. At one point Poirot says to his companion and chronicler, Captain Hastings, "It is your destiny to stand beside me and prevent me from com-

mitting the unforgivable error."

"What do you call the unforgivable error?"

"Overlooking the obvious." (Agatha Christie, *The A.B.C. Murders*, 1936.)

Whether this is the truly unforgivable error may be up for debate, but it certainly is a common human one. Recall the popular online video where they ask you to count the basketball passes, and then ask you about the gorilla that parades across the screen, and even pauses to stop and thump its chest. Most people don't notice the gorilla; they're so intent on counting the passes.

There's also the blind spot in every human eye where the nerve is attached to the retina so that it can send messages to the brain. Of course, this part of the eye cannot see, so the brain fills in what it assumes would be there.

In Genesis 21 (which we read on Rosh Ha-shanah), we have a version of the unforgivable error. Hagar is sent away because Sarah cannot abide her, and the influence of Hagar's son on Sarah's son. Hagar wanders in the wilderness of Be'er Sheva. Convinced that they will die, she hides her son under a shrub and moves away a distance because she cannot bear to see him die. She weeps loudly. Then God opens her eyes, and she sees a well of water. She fills her skin with water. The well was there all along; she just didn't see it.

How often we miss the obvious. Helen Keller recounts, in *The World I Live In*, that she walks with people who see, but they don't notice the world around them. She writes, "They have the sunset, the morning skies, the purple of distant hills, yet their souls voyage through the enchanted world with nothing but a barren stare." Her reaction, "It were far better to sail forever in the night of blindness with sense and feeling and mind, than to be thus content with the mere act of seeing."

We overlook the obvious, and miss both the beauty in the world and the blessings around us. We also miss opportunities for fulfillment which we already possess. "If only I had this...," "if only circumstances were different...," "if only the mood were better...," etc. We don't see what we have. We should step back and ask, are we making the fundamental error?

The rabbis tried to inculcate in us the idea that we have everyday miracles which we should choose to see, and for which we should thank God. This idea is so fundamental, it's in the prayerbook, and we say it three times a day: "We thankfully acknowledge You...for Your miracles that accompany us each day, and for Your wonders and gifts that are with us each moment; evening, morning, and noon."

Hasidim tell a story about a poor Jew named Itsiq in Krakow. Many nights in a row he dreams that under a bridge in Prague leading to the king's palace is a buried treasure. He goes to Prague and finds the bridge, but he sees a guard. After a few days, the guard asks him what he's doing. He tells the guard about the dream. The guard laughs and tells him about his dream: in Krakow lives a Jew named Itsiq, and a treasure is buried under his stove. "If I believed in dreams, I'd go to Krakow, find Itsiq, and dig under his stove." The man goes home and finds a treasure under his stove. With it, he supposedly built the Synagoga Izaaka.

May we always see the obvious in front of our eyes, and acknowledge it.




Talmud Classes: Tractate Megillah


