

RABBI'S REFLECTIONS: Sukkah: Time, Space, Values





Rabbi Michael Rascoe

Heschel calls Shabbat a 'Tabernacle in Time'. Other religions venerate space and nature. But Torah doesn't designate a holy space. The Tabernacle is built after the sin of the golden calf; it travels. The Temple is to be built in the place which God will choose, later revealed as Jerusalem. Holidays start with

agriculture, but then become associated with events in history and time. This leads to the idea of something beyond the physical and natural; i.e., God controls time. Shabbat occurs at work week's end because it's creation's pinnacle. We need the physical to survive, but we need more to be human and gain an inkling into God, which we do through holiness. God created the world, so God can't be contained in it. (Adon Olam can be translated as: Master of the Universe, Master of Time, Universal Lord, Eternal Lord; so, following Heschel, it emphasizes time and eternality).

Sukkot seems to be the opposite. It's the most physical of the holidays, covering both space and nature. It has the most obsukkah/booth, etrog/citron, palm branch, willow, myrtle. The Rabbis, noting that the Israelites camped in one spot in relatively permanent dwellings for most of the Wilderness wandering, stress the idea that the sukkah reminds us of God's clouds of glory, which protected the Israelites when they stayed under it and obeyed God. But the Bible stresses the physicality: a field hut in which harvest workers dwell so they use every ray of sunlight; hence the Rabbis rule it's not a permanent house, and must have sides which go on the frame before the s'khakh, the thatch.

We erect a structure in open space to claim it as our own. From it we see and experience the natural world, unlike in our regular homes. In the process, we turn this emptiness into a shrine-like space, reminding us of our God, who protects. This carved-out space reminds us to worship and to thank God. In our more permanent homes, we think we control things. Power outages are merely an inconvenience if you have a generator. Only an "act of God," like a hurricane or a fire, jolts us back into reality.

The rabbis require that we move out of the house and erect hut sides before thatching. This reinforces the idea that we depend on God, to whom we must be thankful, and whom we must worship. It also suggests a more theoretical idea: namely that the walls represent our reality and the s'khakh stands for our ideals, which must be based on reality. And above all is God, who controls the physical universe, history, and time; i.e. reality and ideals.



- Temple Israel of Riverhead reserves the right to deny entrance to anyone who does not comply.


