



dinsky, of blessed memory, felt that a major theme of Pesah is dialogue, and it starts before the seder. In the haftarah for Shabbat Ha-Gadol, the prophetic reading on the Sabbath before Passover (Malachi 3:24), God says that

Eliyahu ha-navi, Elijah the prophet, "shall reconcile parents with children and children with their parents" (see below for a different translation). Mosheh, Moses, knows this when he insists before Pharaoh, "young and old: we will go with our sons and daughters...for we must observe [God's] festival" (Exodus 10:9). Pharaoh will only let men go, but Mosheh insists on everyone.

The Bible records that children ask questions, and parents must answer them. This underlies the Four Questions, and leads the Four Children to teach us that it doesn't matter our child's temperament or learning style; we must ensure that they ask questions, and that we answer them.

Every generation questions the next one. 1950's parents complained about their 1960's children's interests and tastes. Today's parents gripe about their children. Every generation complains about the next one's music, clothes, food, language, and body. The styles and issues change; each side reacts. Reactions breed misunderstanding, even distrust.

By having parents and children talk at the seder, the rabbis tell us that dialogue matters. We may disagree, but we must find a way to communicate. Yes, the seder is about a good meal, and feeling good, but at it we talk about everything in life, not just Judaism–a seder is a religious celebration, with a meal, designed to talk about Judaism in our lives. Redemption is the context of both the seder and the haftarah before it. The seder commemorates our redemption from Egypt. At the seder we also await Elivahu, who will bring ultimate redemption. In the haftarah before Pesah, Malachi talks about the coming terrible day of God before which the reconciliation of parents with children and children with parents must take place, if we want to avoid utter destruction. However, we also can translate the haftarah verse: Eliyahu "shall restore the hearts of parents along with children, and children with their parents." In the earlier one, intergenerational reconciliation forestalls God's wrath; in this one, both must restore their relationship and together return to God, in order to avoid utter destruction. May our seder be where the generations talk.

#### Yom Hashoah Program: The Next Generation

Award-winning author **A.J. Sidransky** returns to Temple Israel of Riverhead to lead us on a journey of how to ensure that Holocaust survivors are remembered, and that the world never forgets.

Alan will discuss the basis for two of his novels which specifically detail his relatives' experiences during the Holocaust years, titled **Forgiving Maximo Rothman**, and **The Interpreter**. These books tackle experiences from the Holocaust which are unfamiliar to most people, and add new light to the far-reaching effects beyond the horrors of the concentration camps. Alan will discuss what factors besides just luck were critical for survival. He will then lead us into the impact that Holocaust trauma has had on the children of survivors.

In the second half of this unique program, Alan will interview Shari Gotowner Lopez, whose parents were Holocaust survivors. Her parents had very different survival stories and surreptitiously met in the states following their immigration. The interview will focus on how her parents' history affected her life, and what dynamic existed between them and their children regarding their Holocaust experiences. How did it affect her life and world view? What does she want the world to know and remember? Since her mom's passing, Shari has been looking for ways to communicate her parents' stories, and looks forward to sharing them with the TIR community under Alan's direction.

A question and answer session will follow.

Alan's books will be available for purchase following the program.






