

### RABBI'S REFLECTIONS: Anger: On Fighting Fire With Fire



For firefighters, this can be good advice. For life, it is rarely necessary.

Avi, my son, once asked me for advice. He said that everyone else will tell him to fight, but since I rarely do so, if I tell him to fight, then he will know that he must

fight. I said that he might need to fight, but there might be another way. If you escalate now, there is no going back. And if he must fight, there should be no harm in trying another way first, because he can always escalate it later. In the end, it was a match and not a fire, and he solved it more amicably by not fighting fire with fire.

This recalls a story supposedly told about Shemuel Ha-naggid, an eleventh-century Jewish polymath\* in Muslim Spain. An enemy of his once insulted him in front of the king, and the king told him to cut out the enemy's tongue. Instead, Shemuel treated him kindly. When the king found out, he asked why his order wasn't carried out. Shemuel answered that he had

followed it: he cut out the man's evil tongue and replaced it with a kindly tongue.

I don't usually believe in fighting fire with fire unless there is no other recourse. We are in one of these recurring cycles where we believe that not to fight is a sign of weakness (and once in a while, it is). So we retaliate. We fight hate with hate, anger with anger. When we do so, the fight always escalates, the burning problem intensifies into a conflagration. Sometimes, we're better off removing the fuel source, isolating it, or using water.

Once we're in an argument, some irrationality enters: we can't back down since we must be right at all costs; and/or we can't be perceived as weak. We follow a scorched earth policy. We can't admit we made a mistake, or more likely we both made a mistake, and we both may be partly right. Even if we are right, it escalates because we leave the other party no out, and often they need an out with honor. Sometimes, all they need is a way to tactfully back down.

We can quench with words, too. This can only be done if we cool and soothe. Proverb 15:1 is right: A gentle response allays wrath; a harsh word provokes anger. Try the soft approach.

\* He started as a poor refugee and became a merchant. His language and writing skills brought him to the attention of the vizier of Spain, who conversed with him. He grew to value his advice so much that he made him his secretary. Eventually, as the vizier was dying, he told the king that all of his great advice actually came from a Jew. The king sought him out, and despite the rule that a Jew not hold an office, the king made him vizier, and later, general. He also was a poet, Talmud scholar, and philanthropist.

Dear Fellow Congregant:

Looking forward to the High Holidays, we thought you would like an explanation of Temple Israel's High Holiday ticket process.

With membership, families receive two adult tickets and tickets for all children under age 21. Additional tickets for children over the age of 21 may be purchased for \$125 each. Tickets for other adult family members are available at \$165 each. Non-members may purchase tickets at \$375 each. We are asking that you please add an additional \$72 per seat to help defray the cost of synagogue security for the High Holidays.

According to our Temple's long-standing practice, we make High Holiday seats available at no charge to needy individuals, full-time college students, and active military personnel.

To be courteous and fair to everyone, we ask that you consider the following information when ordering your tickets:

- 1. Each person attending High Holiday services must have a ticket. Tickets are issued for specific seats (as in a theater), and you are expected to occupy the seat designated on your ticket.
- 2. Tickets are non-transferable.
- 3. Inter-married spouse members and individual members may reserve tickets for themselves, their spouses, and children.
- 4. Each year, all but a few seats are reserved in advance; please do not assume that an unoccupied seat is an available seat.
- 5. Tickets cannot be purchased for non-relatives at the member rates.

We appreciate your understanding and cooperation in adhering to the spirit of our ticket process. We are all working diligently to make our High Holiday services meaningful and dignified.








#### Our Judaica Shop
