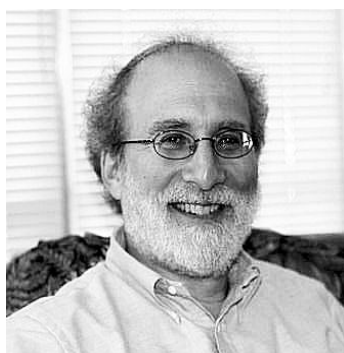

Rabbi Michael Rascoe

Childhood games provide metaphors and techniques for life. Hide-and-seek (also peek-a-boo): a game where one player ("It") tries to find hidden others; a plot-building device in movies.

Rabbi Barukh ben Yehi'el of Medzibezh (1757-1810, grandson of Israel ben Eli'ezer Ba'al Shem Tov, founder of modern Hasidism) told a story. Yehi'el, his grandson, once played hide-and-seek with another boy. Yehi'el hid. He came out eventually but didn't see the boy. The boy never looked. He ran to his grandfather crying about his faithless friend. Rabbi Barukh tearfully mused, "God says, 'I hide, but no one wants to seek me'" (See Deuteronomy 31:18; Isaiah 45:15; Psalm 13:2.)

Do we phrase it this way? We think from our own experience, awaiting proof that contradicts

it. Often we live out Indiana Representative Earl Landgrebe's Watergate hearing comment: "My mind is made up; don't confuse me with the facts."

Dan Pagis, a poet born in Romania, escaped a concentration camp as a teen, after three years, and reached Palestine in 1946. He died in 1986 at 56. (I thank Dr. Anne Lapidus Lerner):

Hide-and-Seek

In a backyard in the Universe
We played, he and I.
I covered my eyes, he hid:
One two three,
Not before me, not behind me
Not within me.

Since then I have been looking
So many years.
So what if I don't find you.
Come out, already, come out,
You see that I have surrendered.

We don't know who started the game, who failed to connect (we did not look up.) We look before, behind, and within us in the familiar, protected backyard of an infinite universe for a hidden, unnamed friend, and discover we are alone. We covered our eyes and God hid, unlike Adam and Eve. We hope we will find God; yet our patience is gone; we have surrendered.

Hide-and-seek is a metaphor for our relationship with God. It simply expresses complex theological issues, reminding

us that a relationship with God is both within our control (we can uncover our eyes,) and beyond our control (it is God.) His frustration mirrors our own. We can only uncover our eyes and hope that God answers our call to appear.

In the poem and the story, the end is not always what we expect, since we can't control everything. Yet we learn that the search itself can be worthwhile. Behind the poem and story lies the search for God, and we need to do our part. As humans, the game of life is not over until we of ashes and dust return to the earth from which we come.

I close with some Biblical verses:

Isaiah 55:6

Seek the Lord while God can be found,
Call to God when God is near.

Amos 5:4

Thus said the Lord to the House of Israel:
Seek Me, and you will live.

Psalms 27:4 One thing I ask of the Lord,
only that do I seek:

to live in the house of the Lord all the days
of my life,
to gaze upon the beauty of the Lord, to
frequent God's temple.

Scholar-in-Residence Weekend at TI

On Friday, May 9, a rapt audience of about 30 congregants was treated to the first of three talks by Dr. Anne Lapidus Lerner, pioneer of Women's Studies at the Jewish Theological Seminary. A leading spokeswoman for Conservative Judaism, Dr. Lerner is known for her studies and portrayal of women in Jewish history and literature.

She began by presenting a new and intriguing viewpoint of Eve's creation, which veered radically away from the familiar patriarchal version: Eve was not an afterthought created from Adam's "rib;" rather humanity was intentionally created with both a masculine and a feminine "side!" Dr. Lerner further supported a feminist interpretation of this story with the observation that Eve had been the knowledge seeker, the one whose actions drove the story.

The subsequent two talks, on Shabbat morning and evening, were equally fascinating in their novel explanations of the roles of women throughout history, shedding new light on familiar passages about the first Jewish family. Dr. Lerner's interpretations consistently and emphatically give great weight to the words and actions of women as movers and shakers throughout our past.

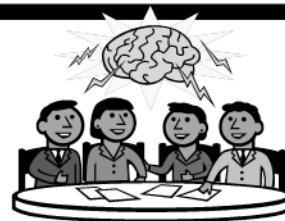
Bieling Bat Mitzvah

Dear Fellow Congregant:

Looking forward to the High Holy Days, we thought you would like an explanation of Temple Israel's High Holy Day ticket process.

The Temple offers High Holy Day tickets at reasonable cost to those who support Temple Israel and Judaism by being or becoming dues-paying members.

According to the Temple's long-standing practice, we make High Holy Day seats available at no charge to needy individuals and to full-time college students. If a member or non-member of Temple Israel is demonstrably in financial straits, we willingly make special arrangements.

To be courteous and fair to everyone, we ask that you consider the following information when ordering your tickets:

1. Each person attending High Holy Day services must have a ticket. Tickets are issued for specific seats (as in a theater,) and you are expected to occupy the seat designated on your ticket.
2. Tickets are non-transferable.
3. Inter-married spouse members and individual members may purchase tickets for themselves, their spouses, and children at the member rate.
4. Each year, all but a few seats are reserved in advance; please do not assume that an unoccupied seat is an available seat.
5. Tickets cannot be purchased for non-relatives at the member rates.

We appreciate your understanding and cooperation in adhering to the spirit of our ticket process. We are all working diligently to make our High Holy Day services meaningful and dignified.

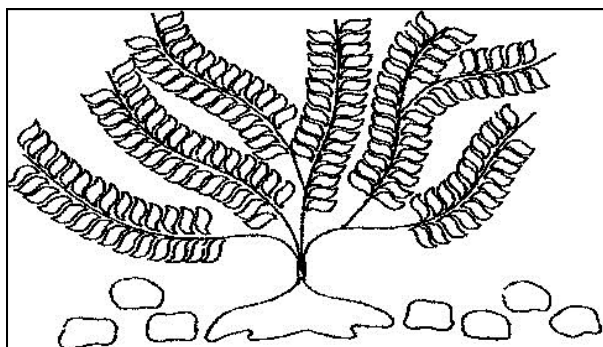


