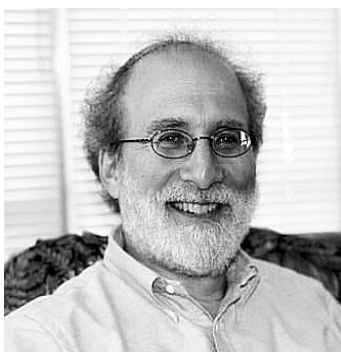

Rabbi Michael Rascoe

Besides being a funny story about anti-Semitism and relating to non-Jews, Purim teaches about life. Mordecai saves the day by working within the king's rules. King Ahasuerus cannot repeal his Jew-killing decree, "for an edict that has been written in the king's name and sealed with the king's signet may

not be revoked." Mordecai issues a new rule requiring Jews to defend themselves. While absurd, it reflects the king's absolute reign, either with the gods behind him, or as a god, which none will question.

While an irreversible decree makes no sense, it fits how many of us view life. Rabbi Stanley M. Rosenbaum notes that people's perceptions change the situation, and that such beliefs and attitudes are self-fulfilling. If people believe a situation cannot change, then their actions or inactions cause that outcome. Often, we underestimate our ability to transform, and exaggerate our inability to make a difference. While we must not deceive ourselves about our abilities, adopting a positive attitude maximizes our efforts.

When facing a major challenge or crisis, Rabbi Rosenbaum observes that people respond in one of four ways. In denial, we ignore or “wish away” the danger. Or, panic and confusion so overwhelm us that we cannot act. Or, we return to the past before the crisis “in the good old days.” Or, we rush to act, without clearly thinking through a plan, and consequently our actions are “so disorganized as to be little more than acts of desperation.” Rabbi Rosenbaum points out that in order to respond effectively, we need “to devise and implement a well-considered and judiciously-constructed plan of action.” It may not work, “but success is rarely achieved without careful planning, hard work, and the positive mental attitude to carry through the plan.”

Judaism, he remarks, emphasizes “life and the disciplined application of human experience to enhance the quality of life.” It inspires “a realistic and positive attitude.” As a young child, he was told “a Jew never despairs.” He writes “disappointment, frustration, defeat, and tragedy may have been our lot from time to time, but the Jew always had hope.” Israel’s national anthem is Hatikvah, (The Hope.) He pens “a... Jewish historian described Judaism’s atti-

tude of determination as reflecting a policy of *af al pi chen v’lamrot hakol* (nevertheless, and despite it all)...even in the face of oppression and loss, the Jewish spirit...resolved to capitalize on the positive and determined to work for a better future.” Most people, through time, hold that “life is determined by forces far beyond human control.” Judaism accepts “the massive impact of physical and social forces,” yet holds that “the individual and the group also shape the future.” When we act “righteous[ly], Jew[s] believe...a higher power...will assist them. In the short run...might may prevail, but in the long run, as the Purim story so aptly describes, right will triumph. Let us continue the tradition!”

One of my favorite sayings is, “perception is more real than reality.” This applies to congregations, politics, and life. We must carefully consider why and what we say and do. A more positive outlook, and admitting that we sometimes need to change, makes life more manageable, and we also may have more friends, be happier, and live longer.

Be happy; it’s Adar. Purim same-ah, Happy Purim.

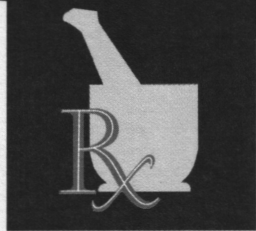

Shorter Services Update

What a wonderful sound 25 voices can make in the vault of our sanctuary! Our second shortened-service beta test (Feb. 4) moved smoothly and fluidly, with no longer the nervousness or tension - those “first night jitters” - that were noticed in the first test.

Again, we started at 9:30 AM and were finished at 11:00, a complete and halachically-correct service. The responses to the first test service were all very positive, including personal ideas and thoughts for change and improvement. Rabbi Michael incorporated these ideas and made additional changes which included more English, and more individuals involved (which was easy because we had 25 people.)

This service ran in a seamless and polished manner; people read and sang together, their sound so beautiful and so big; and you couldn’t get lost because Rabbi Rascoe frequently announced the page numbers.

After the Torah and Haftorah readings, the Rabbi talked about Mary Tyler Moore, sharing uplifting and humorous nostalgia, which the congregation appreciated and responded to. Lisa Israel, Harley Abrams, and Jaime Siegel augmented and facilitated this transition by being in synchrony with the Rabbi, helping the service move as smoothly and quickly as it did, with the congregation moving right along with it.

Following the service was our traditional bagel and lox and schmooze, and there was no rushing or impatience to get out, as there was still plenty of morning available. Attendance was so wonderful, we even had to add an additional table!

The next and last beta test will be on March 18th. We are looking to make the ninety-minute service our standard, keeping in mind that some holidays or Torah and Haftorah parshas may unavoidably increase that time a bit.

The shortened service still offers all the spirituality, warmth, and community needed to end a week of work and start a weekend with plenty of time to spare. Watch for bulletins and come share with us!

Dear Temple Family and Friends:

This will mark the first year we will be participating in the Yom HaShoah **Yellow Candle Program**. We hope you and your family will join with the other members of Temple Israel of Riverhead on Sunday April 23rd, Erev Yom HaShoah, to light this candle in our homes in memory of the victims of the Holocaust.

The act of kindling the flame, and reading the enclosed meditation, can be a moving ritual to remind us of what happened to our people not so long ago. Placing the candle in your window is a way to help remind the community. This moment can also be an appropriate opportunity to discuss the Holocaust with your children.

This is the first year of our participation in this program. The Yom HaShoah **Yellow Candle Program** is a project of the Federation of Jewish Men's Clubs, in cooperation with the Men of Reform Judaism and the United Synagogue of Conservative Judaism.

It is our hope that the observance of Yom HaShoah, centered on the lighting of a Yellow Candle, will become an annual event in your home, and in the home of every member of our congregation. Many congregations have already made this commemoration an important day in their Jewish calendar.

We ask that you help to underwrite the cost of this project. Funds received over and above our program cost will go directly to support future educational programs in our synagogue, which can help to insure the future of our people. We ask that you consider gifts in multiples of \$18. The number 18 is *chai*, life.

By remembering, by doing our part to insure our future, we celebrate the ongoing life of our people, even as we memorialize those who were destroyed in the Shoah. We welcome and appreciate your support of our efforts in this Shoah commemoration, and our on-going educational programs.

The Yellow Candle™ Program - A History

Over seventy years ago, half of the earth's Jewish population perished at the hands of another Amalek, an Austrian house painter who seized control of Europe and threw the earth into darkness. God's light unto the other nations flickered but did not die. A new, modern Exodus arose from the depths of despair and tragedy. From the ashes of Europe, survivors of the Holocaust, or Shoah, made their way towards new lives. Emigrants dispersed around the world, to the new State of Israel, and to the western hemisphere. In these places, they began to rebuild shattered lives. In the following decades, survivors asked another question: How could Yahrzeits be observed for those victims whose entire families had been wiped out? An idea was born: a special memorial candle with yellow wax, in remembrance of the yellow stars forced upon European Jews in the 1930s.



The **Yellow Candle™** was created in 1981 by FJMC clubs in Canada, New England, and elsewhere to keep alive the memory of the Six Million who perished in the Shoah. The Candle is modeled after a traditional Jewish memorial Yahrzeit candle that burns for 24 hours during periods of mourning and on the Yahrzeit anniversary of a family member. The candle's yellow wax serves to remind us of the yellow arm band which Jews were forced to wear during the Nazi regime. A photo on the candle container shows young people visiting Auschwitz-Birkenau concentration camp. This reflects the importance of teaching our youth the lessons of the Holocaust and of remembering the Six Million. In addition, the program logo is a yellow Magen David (Star of David) outlined with barbed wire, with the word "Jude" in the middle. This preserves the memory of the armband or cloth patch that Jews were forced to wear in the ghettos of Eastern Europe.

For Jewish people, remembering a victim is a great mitzvah.

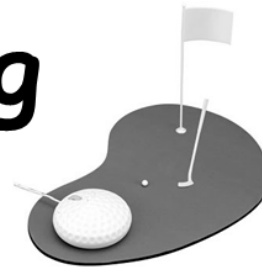

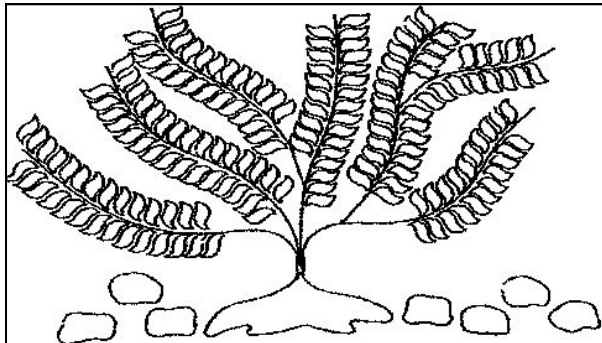

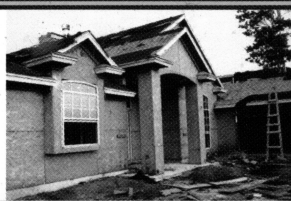
