





# RABBI'S REFLECTIONS Israel at 76 Still is Here to Stay





This story dates back to the early days of the State of Israel: A US businessperson happened upon an Israeli moving huge rocks by hand from the Jerusalem hills. For a bit the tourist watched him labor under a hot sun, sweat drenching his shirt. Finally, the businessperson said to

Rabbi Michael Rascoe the businessperson said to the laborer, "You know, I wouldn't do that for one million dollars." The worker paused his labor and replied, "Neither would I."

This was the attitude in the early days, both pre- and post-statehood. They worked the Holy Land that Mark Twain in *Innocents Abroad* thought was the most God-forsaken place he'd ever seen, with its swamps and malaria, desert and wasteland, and wretched, sick, impoverished people who could hardly scratch a living from the soil.

What he didn't understand was that Jews had few places to go except home, where many already lived, in rotten conditions like everyone else in that sparsely-populated place that clearly was not The Holy Land by looks.

What he didn't understand was that things were in the wrong place at the wrong time, and that the Zionists understood that only hard work would change the Land. Only human labor would correct the Land's imbalance, and let everyone thrive. While the secular Zionists didn't care about the Holy part of the Land, Rav Kook correctly saw that only through human effort could the Land and its people thrive and make it holy. Both understood that this would benefit everyone. They had a vision of a better place, and sacrificed to build it into an economic, cultural, and spiritual place. They also strove to become a country like every other one. And they were determined to keep it this way. Which of course means that it is flawed, as most Israelis recognize, because we as human beings are flawed. And the inhabitants lost many lives to achieve what they did.

Jews can't go anywhere else, despite what's happening now. Much sweat and death accompanied it then, and now. This may be why Israelis are still resilient and happy, especially compared to the USA, despite everything happening. Not an auspicious 76th birthday this May, but it is what it is. Despite Hamas, Hezbollah, Houthis, ISIS, BDS, Iran, Roger Waters, Neo-Nazis, leftists and rightists, Israel still is here to stay.

PS: In Talmud class, we've been studying how to dispose of holy objects. Certain things, like Torah scrolls, have to be "hidden" (or buried) and their sale can't be used for anything less holy; money raised for building, or from selling, a synagogue can only be used for a synagogue. These are exceptions, even for a Torah scroll or money raised to build a synagogue—to redeem captives and to help the poor. While donations help, better to buy Israeli products to support Israel. One should also know that anything that sounds too simple, usually is, which is exactly what Israel's opponents sell. Please note that I'm not saying everything Israel does is right or can't be criticized, but do so from knowledge, with love; and don't treat Israel differently than any other country of the world. Happy Birthday, Israel.

This will mark the fourth year that we will be participating in the Yom HaShoah Yellow Candle Program, after a 3 year COVID break. We hope that you will join with the other members of Temple Israel of Riverhead and your family on Sunday May 5th, erev Yom HaShoah, and light this candle. We light the candle in our homes in memory of the victims of the Holocaust.

The act of kindling this flame, and reading the enclosed meditation, can be a moving ritual to remind us of what happened to our people not so long ago. Placing the candle in your window is a way to help remind the community. This moment can also be an appropriate opportunity to discuss the Holocaust with your children.

The **Yom HaShoah Yellow Candle Program** is a project of the Federation of Jewish Men's Clubs, in cooperation with the Men of Reform Judaism and the United Synagogue of Conservative Judaism.

It is our hope that the observance of Yom HaShoah, centered on the lighting of a Yellow Candle, will become an annual event in your home and in the homes of every member of our congregation. Many congregations have already made this commemoration an important day in their Jewish calendar.

We ask that you help underwrite the cost of this project. Funds received over and above our program cost will go directly to support future educational programs in our synagogue, helping to insure the future of our people. We ask that you consider gifts in multiples of \$18. The number 18 is *chai*, Life.

By remembering, by doing our part to insure our future, we celebrate the ongoing life of our people, even as we memorialize those destroyed in the Shoah. We welcome and appreciate your support of our efforts in this commemoration and our on-going education programs.

# The Yellow Candle™ Program - A History

Over seventy years ago, half of the earth's Jewish population perished at the hands of another Amalek, an Austrian house painter who seized control of Europe and threw the earth into darkness. God's light unto the other nations flickered but did not die. A new, modern Exodus arose from the depths of despair and tragedy. From the ashes of Europe, survivors of the Holocaust, or Shoah, made their way towards new lives. Emigrants dispersed around the world, to the new State of Israel, and to the western hemisphere. In these places, they began to rebuild shattered lives. In the following decades, survivors asked another question: How could Yahrzeits be observed for those victims whose entire families had been wiped out? An idea was born, a special memorial candle with yellow wax, in remembrance of the yellow stars forced upon European Jews in the 1930s.



The Yellow Candle<sup>TM</sup> was created in 1981 by FJMC clubs in Canada, New England, and elsewhere to keep alive the memory of the Six Million who perished in the Shoah. The Candle is modeled after a traditional Jewish memorial Yahrzeit candle that burns for 24 hours during periods of mourning and on the Yahrzeit anniversary of a family member. The candle's yellow wax serves to remind us of the yellow arm band which Jews were forced to wear during the Nazi regime. A photo on the candle container shows young people visiting Auschwitz-Birkenau concentration camp. This reflects the importance of teaching our youth the lessons of the Holocaust and of remembering the Six Million. In addition, the program logo is a yellow Magen David (Star of David) outlined with barbed wire, with the word "Jude" in the middle. This preserves the memory of the armband or cloth patch that Jews were forced to wear in the ghettos of Eastern Europe.

For Jewish people, remembering a victim is a great mitzvah.






