Dear Friends,

Rabbi William Siemers

I try to steer clear of whatever memes or clichés are current in society, so I would be a natural candidate to decry the coining of Thankgivnukkah – a combination of Thanksgiving and Hanukkah. And I'm sure we will all have had our fill of it by the time it actually comes around. But in this

case I put my contrariness aside, because there is some real magic in how these holidays connect, as they do this year for the last time for 70,000 years. (So this will be one of those "single-use" messages.)

Hanukkah and Thanksgiving have a common religious heritage in that they both flow from the festival of Sukkot. The dependence of Hanukkah is clear: Hanukkah and Sukkot each have 8 days; and where

#### Shabbat Dinners Return November 8th—See Inside

Sukkot was the occasion for the dedication of the Temple, Hanukkah is the time of its rededication. The basis for Shammai's opinion that one should decrease the number of lights with each night is based on the decreasing number of bulls sacrificed over the course of Sukkot. Hanukkah is really Sukkot's colder, darker cousin. And it comes at the time of year when we are in need of a little festivity and lift.

The relationship between Sukkot and Thanksgiving is contested, though I think their connection is obvious. They are both holidays that celebrate harvest's end, when we give thanks for the bounty of the previous year. There are people who say that we can't describe the Puritans' observance of Thanksgiving as a celebration of Sukkot, because the date was later in the year. and in any case the Puritans didn't believe in fixed festivals. Both of those assertions are true enough, but they overlook the fact that in the Torah itself, the timing of Sukkot varies, depending on which part one is reading; some passages

prescribe a fixed date, while some say it should be whenever the harvest is over. We follow the former, but that doesn't mean that people following the latter are not basing their observance on the holiday of Sukkot! So I would lean to the camp which posits a historical connection between Sukkot and Thanksgiving.

And whatever the history, the American Thanksgiving captures the spirit of gratitude and rededication. We reflect on the year past with amazement for what God has brought out of the earth, and we look forward to the challenge of casting light into a vast land where even today the wilderness is never far. It is a gift to be able to come together as Americans and as Jews to give thanks for not only our land but also for this land, and the life which grows forth from it.




