

RABBI'S REFLECTIONS:

Understanding? Know What Pains Me



Rabbi's Reflections: Understanding? Know What Pains Me

A little girl on a train was sobbing uncontrollably, clearly disturbing all the other passengers, who were busy with their usual habits: reading, napping, playing a

game. The older girl accompanying her clearly couldn't manage her. After what seemed an eternity of uninterrupted crying, one irate passenger yelled, "Where's her mother?" The older, harried girl quickly replied, "In the next car." "Well, go get her!" "She can't come." "Why not!?" "She's in her coffin." Hearing this news, everyone in the car expressed their concern and sympathy; for now that they knew the situation, they understood her feelings.

It's easy to pass judgment quickly, as soon as we see something. Unfortunately, we often jump to conclusions without first taking the time to ascertain the actual situation. Determining what's really transpiring is not easy to do, often requiring time and effort. Our

bodies and minds are trained to act first and think later. It was a useful survival mechanism when you might have accidentally entered a tiger's territory 12,000 years ago. React quickly, for it can be the difference between life and death. Most of us, most of the time, don't need this survival mechanism; yet we rely on it all the time. Indeed, people often take pride in how quickly they can walk into a situation and act. We even often reward these 'quick thinkers', as we call them. Oftentimes, they are not thinking; they are reacting to what they immediately perceive. Worse, we can be in a situation for a long time, and still not bother determining what's going on, and why people do what they do. Even worse, we joke about it, "So -and-so's just having a bad day."

Maybe we should instead try to find out whether they really are having a bad day. While treating people poorly is never good, at least sometimes we can understand it, and even commiserate. Being understood often brings about a change in the other person's behavior, or at the least in your own. You might try to find out if your boss is really just a jerk, or believes he has the best way to maintain control. Or, there might be other things involved. I gave an example over the holidays: if you're the boss, study your employees and ask why they behave the way they do.

Watch children at play. Why do they do what they do? What are they trying to tell us? Is this who they are, or what they learn from home? If a person is tense, why? What produces tension? What relieves it?

Open the newspaper: why do people who seem to have everything hate and kill? Why are some rich people dismissive? Do they really have everything? What is everything? Usually people who don't behave well in fact are missing something, while deluding themselves that they have everything. And when it doesn't work, they fill up the lack with buying more everything. Odd to think about society; the more we get, the more we isolate ourselves. The less we have. the more we isolate ourselves. Either way, most people need human interaction. Human interaction is only when we take the time to understand how a person feels.

Understanding never comes easily; yet when we achieve it, the world is better, and we are better for it.

There's an old Russian story, which I've told before, about two drunk Russian peasants in a bar,. One turns to the other and says, "Ivan, I love you." Ivan retorts, "If you love me so much, you'd know what pains me."


Understanding someone means knowing what troubles them, understanding their pain. It's not easy. It takes time. It's also the only way to really get to know the situation.




The Mill Road Cheese Shop, Westhampton Beach, (631) 998-0483, now carries some kosher items.
