



Rabbi Bernard Raskas (originally from St. Louis, though most of his career was in St. Paul), spoke about a St. Louis shoe manufacturer who had a framed sign of his priorities in his office: "God first, others second, shoes third."

Rabbi Michael Rascoe

Is God a priority as we go through life? Rabbi Raskas wondered if our attachment to God is like a rubber band: when stretched, we feel a pull to God, but when things are loose, so is our thinking about God. Is God like a crutch to use when needed, or to sit forgotten in storage? He asked, is God "a convenience, or...our deepest commitment and overriding concern?"

The shoe manufacturer made his concerns clear to everyone: God, other people, shoes, in that order. What would the world be like if everyone thought in this order?

If politicians followed it, the world would be better,

for the order would be: God, other people, my office. (For people who loudly claim that God is first, humanity/other people are not second, which is why they force others to do what they want; indeed, for many of them, they usually convey in actions that God really isn't first; it's their power.)

If family all thought, "God first, family second, me third," they'd stop quarrelling.

Life's tensions would mostly disappear if we put "God first, others second, my desires/drives third." (Cf. the last of the Ten Commandments, and Pirqei Avot.) Rabbi Raskas noted that if we truly believed in God, we would suddenly turn "our values upside down so that we begin to live right side up. When we truly believe in God, we put first things first."

The High Holidays approach. God created the world. We pray to God to forgive our sins. Accordingly, two predominant metaphors are Ruler and Judge sitting with a balance scale. We are not the priority. God is first. Others are second. We are third.

L'shanah tovah tikkatevu. May you be inscribed for a good year.


We are now registering children ages 5 - 12:



Dear Fellow Congregant:

Looking forward to the High Holidays, we thought you would like an explanation of Temple Israel's High Holiday ticket process.

With membership, families receive two adult tickets and tickets for all children under age 21. Additional tickets for children over the age of 21 may be purchased for \$125 each. Tickets for other adult family members are available at \$165 each. Non-members may purchase tickets at \$375 each. We are asking that you please add an additional \$72 per seat to help defray the cost of synagogue security for the High Holidays.

According to our Temple's long-standing practice, we make High Holiday seats available at no charge to needy individuals, full-time college students, and active military personnel.

To be courteous and fair to everyone, we ask that you consider the following information when ordering your tickets:

- 1. Each person attending High Holiday services must have a ticket. Tickets are issued for specific seats (as in a theater), and you are expected to occupy the seat designated on your ticket.
- 2. Tickets are non-transferable.
- 3. Inter-married spouse members and individual members may reserve tickets for themselves, their spouses, and children.
- 4. Each year, all but a few seats are reserved in advance; please do not assume that an unoccupied seat is an available seat.
- 5. Tickets cannot be purchased for non-relatives at the member rates.

We appreciate your understanding and cooperation in adhering to the spirit of our ticket process. We are all working diligently to make our High Holiday services meaningful and dignified.

Break-the-Fast, Monday, Sept. 25th






