



RABBI'S REFLECTIONS How To Live a Life-Honor





Judaism has a complicated relationship with honor. Perhaps it results from the fact and ways that people usually pursue it. Judaism tends to see this as leading away from God. The Talmud notes that honor comes of its own accord (Nedarim 62a) based on how you live your life;

Rabbi Michael Rascoe on how you live your life; which you will not know because people decide whether you are honorable only after you die. Hence, Judaism has these types of sayings about honor:

"Before honor is humility." (Proverbs 15:33)

"Who is honored? One who honors others." (Pirqei Avot 4:1)

"Let your neighbor's honor be as dear to you as your own." (Avot 2:12)

"Hate the person who honors you so that your wisdom may not diminish." (Derekh Erets Zuta 9) And finally,

"It is not a person's place that honors one, but the person honors one's place." (Ta'anit 21b)

Nonetheless, to live by a code of honor is noble. We see this exemplified by Socrates' death. Socrates, a famous Greek philosopher, lived in a fragile Athens

democracy where some of his followers, probably inspired by him, threatened that democracy. After the brutal reign of the Thirty Tyrants, they were dealt with by a judicial sentence of reconciliation that included amnesty. (It became a model for what's now called transitional justice.)

In his context of the fragile restored democracy, Socrates continued to teach his ideas. No longer subject to the reconciliation judgment, his opponents took full advantage by charging him with impiety and corrupting the young. The court condemned him to death. The story goes that a friendly jailer left the door unlocked and Socrates could have fled, which his disciples encouraged him to do. He supposedly said, "When I was a young man, I studied Anaxagoras' book on physics. He would have me believe that I am sitting in this crouched position on my prison cot because of tensions in the tendons over the joints in my legs. But what Anaxagoras doesn't seem to know is that I sit here because I will not break the democratic law of Athens. The people condemned me to drink the hemlock. As a man of honor, I will not creep stealthily away like a coward."

He pointed out that the laws of physics and nature might explain how he sat, but they had no bearing on whether he was or should have been in prison. Moreover, body mechanics certainly did not determine that he chose to die to honor a code of conduct by which he had lived freely and consciously, and taught others to do so. He committed himself to honor. He decided as an act of will that he needed to honor the code of conduct by which he had lived his whole life, or his life and principles would have been a lie, and he would have made a mockery of his honor code. As Ben Sira, later, notes (33:22), "Don't leave a stain on your honor."

The High Holidays are a period of reflection. We live in a society in which we need not make decisions about whether to live or die by our choices. Yet we choose by what code we wish to live. The High Holidays ask us to choose piety and teaching the young, and to choose God, and God's law and morals. How will you choose to live this coming year?

Dear Fellow Congregant:

Looking forward to the **High Holidays**, we thought you would like an explanation of Temple Israel's High Holiday ticket process.

With membership, families receive two adult tickets and tickets for all children under age 21. Additional tickets for children over the age of 21 may be purchased for \$125 each. Tickets for other adult family members are available at \$165 each. Non-members may purchase tickets at \$375 each. We are asking that you please add an additional \$72 per seat to help defray the cost of synagogue security for the High Holidays. Also, to help to defray the cost of Zooming, we are asking non-members who attend services via Zoom to support us by donating \$360.

According to the Temple's long-standing practice, we make High Holiday seats available at no charge to needy individuals, full-time college students, and active military personnel.

To be courteous and fair to everyone, we ask that you consider the following information when ordering your tickets:

- 1. Each person attending High Holiday services must have a ticket. Tickets are issued for specific seats (as in a theater), and you are expected to occupy the seat designated on your ticket.
- 2. Tickets are non-transferable.
- 3. Inter-married spouse members and individual members may reserve tickets for themselves, their spouses, and children.
- 4. Each year, all but a few seats are reserved in advance; please do not assume that an unoccupied seat is an available seat.
- 5. Tickets cannot be purchased for non-relatives at the member rates.

We appreciate your understanding and cooperation in adhering to the spirit of our ticket process. We are all working diligently to make our High Holiday services meaningful and dignified.




Where to purchase kosher food locally

BJ's and **Costco** also have pareve cookies in their bakeries.


