

RABBI'S REFLECTIONS Seeking and Finding



Rabbi Michael Rascoe

Our Talmud class just finished Tractate M'gillah. One of many interesting passages is on 6b: Rabbi Yitshaq (Isaac) said, "If someone says, 'I labored but I did not find,' do not believe him/her. If someone says, 'I did not labor but I found,' do not believe him/her. If someone

says, 'I labored and I found,' believe him/her."

On the surface, this looks like a classic thought behind the examples which appear routinely on thrift shop find sites, the TV series Antiques Roadshow, news reports, etc. In one sense it is. We are exposed to masterpieces yet often don't see them; someone else does, because that person studied in order to find.

This Talmud text context makes clear that it applies to Torah study. It then adds that this does not apply in the same degree to business, where we depend on some amount of divine assistance. Moreover, the Talmud continues that, even regarding Torah study, this applies only to sharpening it. It further notes that maintaining learning depends on divine assistance,

though we can help by reviewing it (Hagigah 9a, Hillel says that there is a difference between someone who reviews 100 times and someone who reviews 101 times). Learning leads to finds.

Similarly, you hear a popular song, and later learn the songwriter lifted it from an older classical or jazz piece. So you listen to the original piece, and discover that it is more moving than the popular piece.

The siddur, prayer book, also is a hidden masterpiece. Parts of it are over 2,000 years old. Sometimes they are changed slightly in the prayer book. A different context also changes it. Some parts came later; some even relatively modern. Yet no matter the age, they were written by people who used the siddur to respond to their issues. As I've said many times, human

nature hasn't changed since the days of the Bible, and we respond because we recognize ourselves and others in it. The same is true of the prayer book. People before us responded to issues in their lives, some of which are our issues, too; and by seeing their responses, we find new insights into our own. Torah and siddur are both hidden masterpieces, which we only realize when we take the trouble to learn, and then respond.

The siddur and Torah enrich our lives, and help us to formulate and inspire our responses. Study well, and enjoy the search. Feel free to join the next class where we will explore the 10th chapter of Pesahim, which discusses what we say at the seder, which becomes much of the Haggadah.



Where to purchase kosher food locally


