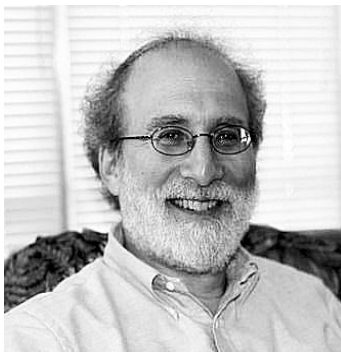

Rabbi Michael Rascoe

In an old Yiddish story, two communal leaders, feuding over some perceived slight, divide the community. The rabbi, saddened by the state of affairs, can no longer tolerate their behavior or the dissension it causes, and decides to take steps to end it. After a Rosh Hashanah service, the rabbi calls the leaders into the study. After being reminded of the nature of the day, and that the purpose of the High Holidays is to forgive one another, the two pledge to end the fight and renew their friendship. As they leave, the rabbi reminds them that in keeping with tradition, they should wish each other a good year. One turns to the other and says, "I wish you everything that you wish for me in the coming year."

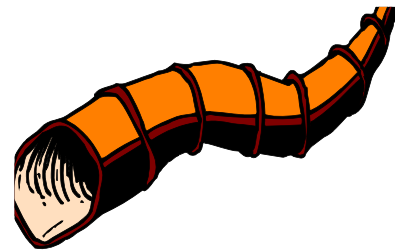

The other quickly replies, “Aha, there you go, starting it all over.”

Broken relationships need a certain level of trust and good faith in order to repair them, or else the actions are meaningless, or even disastrous. As humans, by definition we make mistakes, we do wrongs, and we will hurt, as well as be hurt. The High Holidays remind us of this simple fact. The days assume that we can right our errors and repair our relationships, but we often need a nudge to do so. If we repent in honesty and apologize with sincerity, we can repair our mistakes. These days remind us that in order to be forgiven, we must first forgive (after Yoma 23a). As the old adage goes, to err is human; to forgive is divine.

Dear Fellow Congregant:

Looking forward to the High Holidays, we thought you would like an explanation of Temple Israel's High Holiday ticket process. **Please note** that if you wish to attend in-person you must provide proof of vaccination to the temple office, and you must have a reservation, both due by August 17th. At no time will anyone be admitted to the building without having provided this proof prior to the holiday, and secured an advance, confirmed reservation. For everyone's safety, there will be no exceptions.

With membership, families receive two adult tickets and tickets for all children under age 21. Additional tickets for children over the age of 21 may be purchased for \$100 each. Tickets for other adult family members are available at \$140 each. Non-members may purchase tickets at \$350 each. We are asking that you please add an additional \$54 per seat to help defray the cost of synagogue security for the High Holidays.

According to the Temple's long-standing practice, we make High Holiday seats available at no charge to needy individuals, full-time college students, and active military personnel.

To be courteous and fair to everyone, we ask that you consider the following information.

1. Each person attending High Holiday services must have a ticket. Tickets are issued for specific seats, and you are expected to occupy the seat designated on your ticket.
2. Tickets are non-transferable.
3. Inter-married spouse members and individual members may reserve tickets for themselves, their spouses, and their children.
4. Each year, all but a few seats are reserved in advance; please do not assume that an unoccupied seat is available.
5. Tickets cannot be purchased for non-relatives at the member rates.

We appreciate your understanding and cooperation in adhering to the spirit of our ticket process. We are all working diligently to make our High Holiday services meaningful and dignified.

- ✧ If you wish to attend in person you must provide proof of vaccination to the temple office, and you must have a reservation, due by August 17th. At no time will anyone be admitted to the building without having provided this proof and obtained this reservation. For everyone's safety there will be no exceptions.
- ✧ Anyone entering the building must agree to submit to a temperature check, and to the health and safety protocols.
- ✧ We also request that every effort be made to stay for the entire service.
- ✧ If you do not feel well, please do not come to services. If you have been exposed to someone who has or who may have Covid-19, please stay at home.
- ✧ Temple Israel of Riverhead reserves the right to deny entrance to anyone who does not comply.

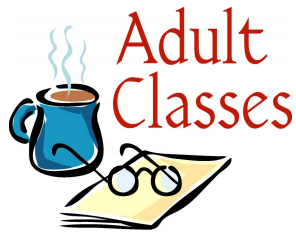

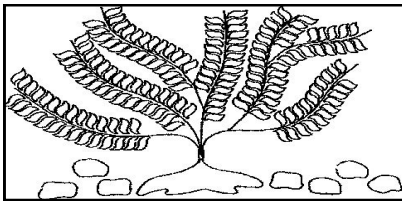
