

RABBI'S REFLECTIONS One Day at a Time





Rabbi Michael Rascoe

In homiletics class, we were taught everything in life can be grist for a sermon: a book, a movie, life. Rabbi Sidney Greenberg told a story long ago about how once on a trip he stopped for coffee, and decided he would get back

on the road quicker ordering at the counter. The waitress' name plate read, "Tex." With few patrons around, and Tex's warm, friendly smile beckoning, they began chit-chatting.

Soon she poured out her story: she was raising two young boys alone after her husband's accidental death caved in her world. She felt loss and desolation but still had to take care of two young boys alone. Panic and helplessness gripped her as she realized she now was both father and mother to her children with this awesome responsibility looming for many years ahead. She worried how she'd manage the frightening times and how she'd be able to care for herself and her two boys.

For a long time she brooded and worried at home. "Then one night," she said, "as I tossed sleeplessly, it came to me. I realized that I didn't have to solve all my problems at once. All I had to do was get through one day. For one day, I could be strong enough, smart enough, and tough enough. One day at a time. That thought saw me through."

When asked what happened to her sons, he was told one became a doctor and the other was in medical school.

As Tex poured coffee she passed on an important life lesson: Life often does not go as planned, and we often add to our anxiety and pain in times of trouble and travail. Life often seems full of many hurdles that come one after another and we wonder how we'll jump them. Luckily, we aren't hurdlers, so we can look at just one hurdle and one day at a time. This way we muster the courage to go on, and usually we are up to the task.

Emerson once wrote: "The hero is no braver than an ordinary [person], but ... is brave five minutes longer." We become heroes by lasting just five minutes longer. Five minutes eventually becomes an hour, an hour, a day, a day a week, a week a month, a month a year, a year into years.

Rabbi Greenberg also notes that Psalm 23 states we "walk" through deepest darkness (or shadow of death). We "walk" by taking one step at a time. We can neither go around deepest darkness, nor run through it. It takes walking one step at a time to get through it. Or as Tex put it, one day at a time.

This is what we do as Jews. The Romans destroyed the Temple almost 2,000 years ago and we became an even larger exilic community. Some didn't want to go on, mourning excessively and denying much of life. To live life, we had to find a balance be-

Dear Fellow Congregant:

Looking forward to the High Holidays, we thought you would like an explanation of Temple Israel's High Holiday ticket process.

With membership, families receive two adult tickets and tickets for all children under age 21. Additional tickets for children over the age of 21 may be purchased for \$125 each. Tickets for other adult family members are available at \$165 each. Non-members may purchase tickets at \$375 each. We are asking that you please add an additional \$72 per seat to help defray the cost of synagogue security for the High Holidays. Also, to help to defray the cost of Zooming, we are asking non-members who attend services via Zoom to support us by donating \$360. According to the Temple's long-standing practice, we make High Holiday seats available at no charge to needy individuals, full-time college students, and active military personnel. To be courteous and fair to everyone, we ask that you consider the following information when ordering your tickets:

Each person attending High Holiday services must have a ticket. Tickets are issued for specific seats (as in a theater), and you are expected to occupy the seat designated on your ticket.

2. Tickets are non-transferable.

Inter-married Spouse Members and Individual Members may reserve tickets for themselves, their spouses and children.

- 4. Each year, all but a few seats are reserved in advance; please do not assume that an unoccupied seat is an available seat.
- 5. Tickets cannot be purchased for non-relatives at the member rates.

We appreciate your understanding and cooperation in adhering to the spirit of our ticket process. We are all working diligently to make our High Holiday services meaningful and dignified.







BJ's and Costco also have pareve cookies in their bakeries.


