

RABBI'S REFLECTIONS

Suffering is not redemptive, but can be instructive



Tish'ah B'av, 9 Av, is Monday evening, August 12, to Tuesday night, August 13. Both Temples were destroyed, and many other catastrophes occurred, both ancient and modern, including European Jewish expulsions and World War 1. Yet, 9 Av is not totally terrible: the

messiah will be born on this day, and in the future it will become a day of rejoicing. Fast days' purpose is not to suffer, but to afflict our souls; hence many of our practices. Suffering can serve other purposes.

Religion has trouble explaining why people suffer. The classic answer is that it will be righted in the world to come. Yet what is its place in life? Christians classically believe that it is redemptive, because Jesus suffered on humanity's behalf. When Reverend Billy Graham went to the Soviet Union, he never raised an outcry over Baptists in the gulag, and there were more of them numerically than Jews. (Maybe it's one of the reasons why Christians don't care about the Copts and the Maronites who suffer.) For classic Christians, you will be better for having suffered. Suffer, for it brings one closer to God. Pagans

didn't care in some way; it was the whim of the gods, or was predetermined. While it has some benefit, it is not the Jewish way or belief. Jews act based on suffering

Jews at best see suffering as instructive despite Job shattering all reasons for why we suffer. The general Jewish attitude is that while God ultimately causes our suffering, God does not delight in it. God and we want life to be good. Nahum and Rabbi Akiva's life's attitude is that when bad things happen, this too is for the good. But this is not the norm. Suffering can be like pain. When in pain, we try to find out why, and stop it. Proverbs 30:8-10 note that both poverty and riches distance us from God: poverty grinds us down, and we stop caring; while riches make us think we did it ourselves. More typical is the festival Musaf prayer: we learn that it is on account of our sins we were exiled. The Rabbis assign the destruction of the Temples to sins. In this way, we learn to change our behavior. We don't repeat the past's mistakes; we act based on what we learn from suffering.

The classic Jewish response is to learn from it. We were slaves in Egypt. Bad, right? It happened, so learn from it: You shall not wrong or oppress a stranger, for you were strangers in the land of Egypt (Exodus 22:20 and elsewhere). If you were bullied, learn not to bully. If you were humiliated, learn not to humiliate. Scholars note that the Germans were angry at their treatment by the French after

WW1, so they supported the Nazis. The correct lesson is to learn to break the cycle. We all suffer. The only good that can come from it is to learn to do good because you suffered.

Another lesson is to learn to never tolerate suffering. Rabbi Stephen Wise visited China before WW2. The predominant means of transportation was the rickshaw, often pulled by frail workers who coughed as they dragged their burdens. He was horrified. He later asked his hosts about it, and they reassured him, "Don't worry. In two weeks, you will get used to it. In a month you won't even hear it." "And so it was," Rabbi Wise recalled. He later referred to this day as "the most embarrassing day of my life." Never become used to another person's suffering.

I close with a reaction by a Jew exiled from Spain in 1492 who was put ashore in some uninhabited place, who watched his wife and two children die: "Lord of the universe, You are doing much to make me desert my faith. But I assure you that—even against the will of...heaven, a Jew I am, and a Jew I shall remain. And neither the sufferings that You have brought upon me, nor the sufferings which You yet shall bring upon me, will be of any avail (Shevet Yehudah 52; cf Zvi Kolits, "Yossel Rakover's Appeal to God").

This year, Brad will be creating a presentation of items from Jewish Historical Society of Long Island as a sort of "show and tell." The current exhibit of "101 Jewish Long Islanders" at the LI Jewish History Museum will be incorporated in his talk and will include a history of the earliest Jews in Riverhead.

Brad Kolodny has photographed more than 600 synagogues in 13 countries over the last 30+ years including every synagogue building from Great Neck to Montauk. He has worked for The New York Times since 1996, is president of the Jewish Historical Society of Long Island, and an active member at Midway Jewish Center in Syosset. Brad's second book, *The Jews of Long Island 1705-1918*, published by SUNY Press, was released in March 2022.

Dear Fellow Congregant:

Looking forward to the **High Holidays**, we thought you would like an explanation of Temple Israel's High Holiday ticket process.

With membership, families receive two adult tickets and tickets for all children under age 21. Additional tickets for children over the age of 21 may be purchased for \$125 each. Tickets for other adult family members are available at \$165 each. Non-members may purchase tickets at \$375 each. We are asking that you please add an additional \$72 per seat to help defray the cost of synagogue security for the High Holidays. Also, to help to defray the cost of Zooming, we are asking non-members who attend services via Zoom to support us by donating \$360.

According to the Temple's long-standing practice, we make High Holiday seats available at no charge to needy individuals, full-time college students, and active military personnel.

To be courteous and fair to everyone, we ask that you consider the following information when ordering your tickets:

- 1. Each person attending High Holiday services must have a ticket. Tickets are issued for specific seats (as in a theater), and you are expected to occupy the seat designated on your ticket.
- 2. Tickets are non-transferable.
- 3. Inter-married spouse members and individual members may reserve tickets for themselves, their spouses and children.
- 4. Each year, all but a few seats are reserved in advance; please do not assume that an unoccupied seat is an available seat.
- 5. Tickets cannot be purchased for non-relatives at the member rates.

We appreciate your understanding and cooperation in adhering to the spirit of our ticket process. We are all working diligently to make our High Holiday services meaningful and dignified.




The Mill Road Cheese Shop, Westhampton Beach, (631) 998-0483, now carries some kosher items.


