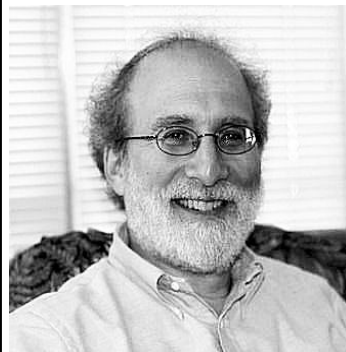

RABBI'S REFLECTIONS: What's With Organized Religion?

I hear: "I believe in God but not organized religion." This idea both makes no sense, and reflects reality.

Organized religion is old. We have records—drawn, built, and written. Abraham and his descendants built altars, but not much happened until Exodus 25, with the Tabernacle, and then in 1 Kings 8 (& 2 Chron 6), with the Temple. At some point, we confused the building with the God religion.

What is it about organized religion? We wouldn't say, I believe in medicine but not medical schools or hospitals; I believe in law and justice but not law schools and courts; I believe in art/architecture/music but not in art/architecture/music schools and artists/architects/musicians.

Ideally, a shul provides the text and texture of Jewish life, a place where God and community, young to old, gather when life is bad (funeral) and good (birth/wedding). It nourishes souls, minds, and emotions; provides guidance, solace, inspiration; cherishes memories, beliefs, and hopes; confers significance to dignity, meaning, and purpose; and sustains them when times are bad or good. Morris Raphael Cohen noted, in his youth, he favored prophets and revolution, but as he aged, he realized that we need a place, the synagogue, to keep us going, sustain and renew us, and channel it into everyday life, for we can't live just on revolution and ideas.

Yet along the way, the shul stopped being these things. When I was little, we heard it phrased, "You can't prove it by me." The phrase has changed; the sentiment hasn't. Synagogues don't prove the importance of worship or education to most Jews; we observe Shabbat and kashrut in the breach not as a proof; and the home is no better, which really used to be Judaism's center. If Judaism is the way a Jew looks at the world and provides a way to live in it, we can't prove it. Feeling good about being Jewish is great for a still OK number of

Jews, but what exactly does it mean to feel Jewish, if it's not expressed or lived? And it's not good for the shul.

Synagogues became edifices to a stage of being at home in America. Now we feel "at home" (but, if we're honest, we should wonder if we really are as "at home" as we thought a year or two ago). Feeling good doesn't transfer through the generations. Values might, if we lived and taught them. It worked as the edifice builders erected these structures, for they were raised with a certain set of Jewish values and knowledge. But now?

The Bible actually tells us the sanctuary's purpose. It is not a place where God dwells, as it was in other cultures, but "a sanctuary that God may dwell among them" (Ex 25:8). As Exodus, Kings, and Chronicles note, no place on earth can contain God. The synagogue is the place that becomes a sanctuary: not a place in which God dwells in a building, but a place in which God dwells in the person; not a place to contain God, but a place from which God radiates; not a place to reflect the glory of God, but a place from which we reflect God's glory. The syna-

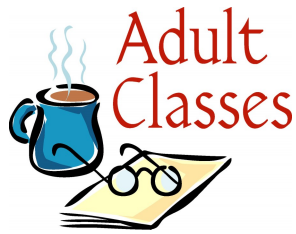

gogue is a place in which it is easier to find God and recharge, so that we can leave it and bring God into the world. As we discussed in our Talmud class, both in this and in the previous tractate, we need to live our lives by means of Torah so that we become Torah, and our lives and behavior become

the vehicle by which others learn about God. The synagogue is supposed to be the place from which it happens, furthering what is supposed to be learned in the home. Let the synagogue live up to its promise: “They will make me a sanctuary that I will dwell among them.”

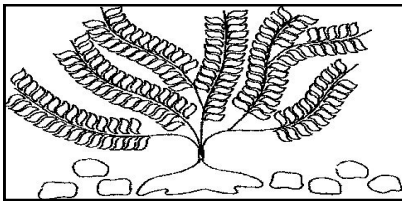
