

# RABBI'S REFLECTIONS Perseverance and Optimism Lead to

Thomas Edison didn't dwell on failure. He once said, "I have not failed 10,000 times—I've successfully found 10,000 ways that will not work." When someone asked about all the money he spent on "failures," he said, "Oh, my God; we spent a fortune on that...we had fun spending it."

Albert Sabin, MD, who developed the oral polio vaccine, supposedly tried almost 2,000,000 experiments to develop and perfect it. His interest began in 1931. He started work in 1934. He tested it on 10,000 monkeys and 160 chimpanzees, as well as himself, his family, his research assistants, and many volunteers in the area and around the world, including 77 million just in the Soviet Union. In the early 1960s, it rolled out in the USA.\* Sabin later said, "The art of prevention is difficult indeed, but it is worth it."

I thought about this at an interfaith clergy meeting where we heard a presentation about the new mental health clinic for youth soon to open in Riverhead. Care for the behavioral and mental state of people in

this country is poor, which has consequences for the state of the country. So do the anti-vaxxers. And, of course, Covid is still in our minds, as is the flu, RSV, etc. Combined with the other problems facing our county, it is time to remind people not just to get their vaccines, but once again to appreciate all the people in our communities and everywhere else who help prevent illness of our, our children's, and our grandchildren's bodies, minds, and souls. We also need to remember more than just the health professionals, as lay people also sit on boards and devote time and money to fund the various educational, teaching, and research institutions.

This is true not just of hospitals, but of other institutions which make our communities what they are and affect our well-being. Imagine places without a hospital, a synagogue, a library, a museum, a park, etc. All these institutions protect us in various ways.

Indeed, Jewish law requires that a scholar must live in a place with the following 10 institutions (Sanhedrin 17b):

- A) societal requirements: (1) a court with the power to flog and punish, and the personnel to carry out everything, because justice is a societal value; (2) a tsedaqah fund, collected by two people and distributed by three, because treating the poor is a basic societal value, as is its integrity;
- B) communal spiritual and physical needs: (3) synagogue; (4) bathhouse; (5) wash/restroom;
- C) personal spiritual and physical needs: (6) a doctor; (7) a skilled craftsman (following RaShI, a bloodletter; nowadays a surgeon); (8) clerk (book writer, according to RaShI; often understood of Jewish

texts and documents); (9) according to some texts, a butcher; (10) a teacher of children. Rabbi Aqiva adds a variety of fruit because they enlighten the eyes (it is unclear whether he requires this for health or for aesthetic reasons).

The fascinating point about this teaching is that it not only assumes basic values, but also requires us to be proactive in advance, so that we don't find ourselves in bad situations. It substantiates the basic idea that an ounce of prevention is worth a pound of cure. Not only must we be proactive in prevention, but we get there by persevering, and optimistically creating the place in which we wish to live.

\* The Sabin vaccine quickly surpassed the Jonas Salk, MD, polio vaccine because the Salk vaccine had trouble when Cutter Laboratories sent out vaccines with the live, not inactive, polio virus. This is why the biggest trials of the Sabin vaccine were conducted elsewhere around the world.

Salk and Sabin grew up in the Jewish immigrant world of the early 1900s, went to NYU Medical School, because it didn't discriminate against Jews, and refused to patent their vaccines, in order to keep costs low so more people would use it and polio could be eradicated. Salk, speaking on who owns the patent: "Well, the people, I would say. There is no patent. Could you patent the sun?" Sabin on why there is no patent: "A lot of people insisted that I should patent the vaccine, but I didn't want to do that...It's my gift to all the world's children."

### Dear Fellow Congregant:

Looking forward to the **High Holidays**, we thought you would like an explanation of Temple Israel's High Holiday ticket process.

With membership, families receive two adult tickets and tickets for all children under age 21. Additional tickets for children over the age of 21 may be purchased for \$125 each. Tickets for other adult family members are available at \$165 each. Non-members may purchase tickets at \$375 each. We are asking that you please add an additional \$72 per seat to help defray the cost of synagogue security for the High Holidays. Also, to help to defray the cost of Zooming, we are asking non-members who attend services via Zoom to support us by donating \$360.

According to the Temple's long-standing practice, we make High Holiday seats available at no charge to needy individuals, full-time college students, and active military personnel.

To be courteous and fair to everyone, we ask that you consider the following information when ordering your tickets:

- 1. Each person attending High Holiday services must have a ticket. Tickets are issued for specific seats (as in a theater), and you are expected to occupy the seat designated on your ticket.
- 2. Tickets are non-transferable.
- 3. Inter-married spouse members and individual members may reserve tickets for themselves, their spouses, and children.
- 4. Each year, all but a few seats are reserved in advance; please do not assume that an unoccupied seat is an available seat.
- 5. Tickets cannot be purchased for non-relatives at the member rates.

We appreciate your understanding and cooperation in adhering to the spirit of our ticket process. We are all working diligently to make our High Holiday services meaningful and dignified.






### Where to purchase kosher food locally

**BJ's** and **Costco** also have pareve cookies in their bakeries.


