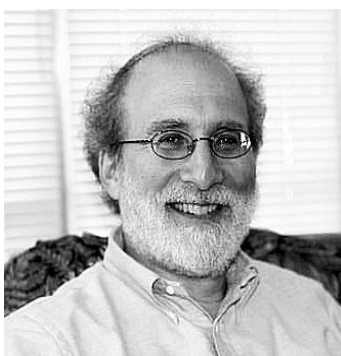

Upon my return from vacation, I spoke on how the Bible's discussion of the false prophet provides advice on distinguishing fake news from the left and right. Constantly re-examining ideas is the only way, because only God is perfect, and we are not. I also noted that we need to be careful about our ideas, for our brain likes to fill in gaps, and is wired to do so. After all, we have a hole in our eye which we fill; otherwise, we wouldn't be able to see in the spot where the nerve connects the eye to the brain. So if we're used to filling in gaps in one area, we also do it in others, like thinking.

## The High Holy Days come early this year. Information inside!

Wisdom is the ability to know how, what, why, and when to accept, and its corollary: how, what, why, and when to reject, something. Oddly, both monotheistic religion and paganism suffer from this dilemma. In paganism, it's pointless because life keeps repeating, and the gods are stronger than we are; though, of course, the fates are strongest of all. In monotheistic religion, some argue it's pointless, for God said what needed to be said.

As an example, when anesthesia (first ether, then chloroform) was introduced in obstetrics in the USA in 1840 and in Britain in 1846, some of the objections were based in religion: it shouldn't be used because of God's curse of Eve. (There were other objections, like the medical value of pain, that birth pain is transitory, and anesthetics' addictive possibilities.)

There also is the general view of the mystery of God's world, and only God knows everything, which is a general response to suffering. What avail is it to question God when we can never hope to know everything?

Judaism generally rejects both arguments. As to the second, the mystery of creation,

this was rejected by the Book of Job, among others. As to the second, Judaism also sees the Biblical verse that we are commanded to heal. It's well known that Jewish law allows almost anything to save a life, and that even Shabbat restrictions are set aside to save a life (this last part dates back to the Maccabees). Indeed, the Talmud includes pain and suffering when trying to determine what someone pays for injuring another, and the injured party is expected to see a doctor, whose expenses are covered, and the doctor is expected to heal. In Song of Songs Rabbah 4:5:1, we read that God created the remedy before the illness.

Interestingly, the passage in Song of Songs Rabbah uses the metaphor of the doctor and patient to apply to God forgiving sins, that the cure for sin was created before humanity sinned. It is interesting that the two were joined so long ago, that forgiveness and wisdom also seem to go hand in hand. Maybe this pairing suggests that in our wisdom we should have humility to realize that we are not always right, and that the only way to know is to keep learning and not get set in our ways, as I said on that Shabbat.

Dear Fellow Congregant:

Looking forward to the High Holidays, we thought you would like an explanation of Temple Israel's High Holiday ticket process. **Please note** that if you wish to attend in-person you must provide proof of vaccination to the temple office, and you must have a reservation, both due by September 3d. At no time will anyone be admitted to the building without having provided this proof prior to the holiday, and secured an advance, confirmed reservation. For everyone's safety, there will be no exceptions.

With membership, families receive two adult tickets and tickets for all children under age 21. Additional tickets for children over the age of 21 may be purchased for \$100 each. Tickets for other adult family members are available at \$140 each. Non-members may purchase tickets at \$350 each. We are asking that you please add an additional \$54 per seat to help defray the cost of synagogue security for the High Holidays.

According to the Temple's long-standing practice, we make High Holiday seats available at no charge to needy individuals, full-time college students, and active military personnel.

To be courteous and fair to everyone, we ask that you consider the following information.

1. Each person attending High Holiday services must have a ticket. Tickets are issued for specific seats, and you are expected to occupy the seat designated on your ticket.
2. Tickets are non-transferable.
3. Inter-married spouse members and individual members may reserve tickets for themselves, their spouses, and their children.
4. Each year, all but a few seats are reserved in advance; please do not assume that an unoccupied seat is available.
5. Tickets cannot be purchased for non-relatives at the member rates.

We appreciate your understanding and cooperation in adhering to the spirit of our ticket process. We are all working diligently to make our High Holiday services meaningful and dignified.

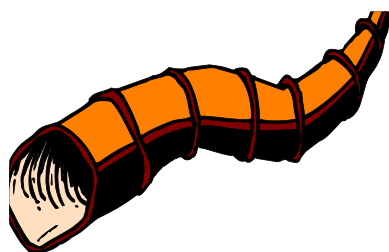

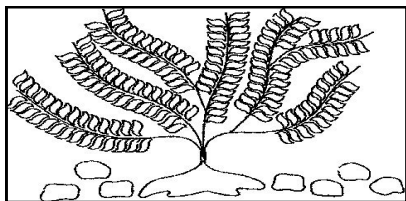
