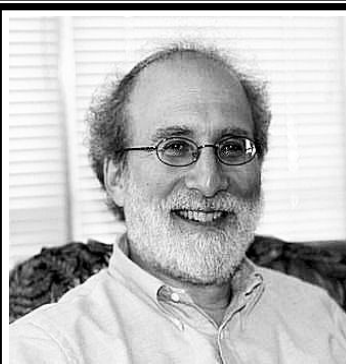

RABBI'S REFLECTIONS: We're the Answer

Supposedly, during the Sinai Campaign of 1956 (aka the Suez Crisis), after an Israeli attack forced the Egyptian army from their post, the troops dug in and awaited the counterattack. Two forward soldiers were under fire for days, expecting a ferocious counterattack. One hollow-eyed soldier said to the other, "Why haven't they tried to take back this position yet?" The other looked at him and said, "anahnu ha-t'shuvah," "we're the answer."

This soldier teaches us a lesson: "we're the answer". An individual can look at a situation and see the problem. While part of the problem, an individual often fails to see that he or she also is the answer to the problem. Problems don't solve themselves; we solve them. We can look at the situation, see just the problem, and that we cause it. But it requires a certain insight and confidence to know that we also are the solution. When we realize that we have the potential to solve a problem, we can then formulate a

solution based on this understanding.

While larger forces are at work, they don't solve problems; individuals do. More importantly, one individual can influence another just by doing; and as more people act, more people see that the problem appears solvable.

The danger is when a demagogue stops us from being ourselves or thinking for ourselves, either because of one person's outlook, or because the issues are too big for us to solve as individuals but only societal force. Either way, we're doing just what the demagogue wants. Both the left and the right want us to do their bidding, without this crucial step of thinking for ourselves about what is best for both ourselves and for society.

To use another military analogy: we send up missiles and satellites. The smallest part, and the most critical, is the guidance system; otherwise, they never do what we intend. We need to go through life realizing that we're the answer responding to our guidance system, which demands that we move in a meaningful way towards a goal which we direct that is larger than us, but that includes us. Sharpening our spiritual sensitivities may help us figure out what the direction is, what the goal is, and realize that we're the answer.

L'shanah tovah tikkatevu v'thatemu. May you be inscribed and sealed for a good (and healthy) year.

Dear Fellow Congregant:

Looking forward to the High Holidays, we thought you would like an explanation of Temple Israel's High Holiday ticket process. **Please note** that if you wish to attend services in person you must provide proof of vaccination to the temple office, and you must have a reservation, both due by September 9th. At no time will anyone be admitted to the building without having provided proof of vaccination to the temple office prior to the holiday, and secured an advance, confirmed reservation. For everyone's safety there will be no exceptions.

With membership, families receive two adult tickets and tickets for all children under age 21. Additional tickets for children over the age of 21 may be purchased for \$125 each. Tickets for other adult family members are available at \$165 each. Non-members may purchase tickets at \$375 each. We are asking that you please add an additional \$72 per seat to help defray the cost of synagogue security for the High Holidays.

According to the Temple's long-standing practice, we make High Holiday seats available at no charge to needy individuals, full-time college students, and active military personnel.

To be courteous and fair to everyone, we ask that you consider the following information when ordering your tickets:

1. Each person attending High Holiday services must have a ticket. Tickets are issued for specific seats (as in a theater), and you are expected to occupy the seat designated on your ticket.
2. Tickets are non-transferable.
3. Inter-married spouse members and individual members may reserve tickets for themselves, their spouses, and children.
4. Each year, all but a few seats are reserved in advance; please do not assume that an unoccupied seat is an available seat.
5. Tickets cannot be purchased for non-relatives at the member rates.

We appreciate your understanding and cooperation in adhering to the spirit of our ticket process. We are all working diligently to make our High Holiday services meaningful and dignified.

- ✧ Anyone entering the building must agree to submit to a temperature check, and to the health and safety protocols.
- ✧ We also request that every effort be made to stay for the entire service.
- ✧ If you do not feel well, please do not come to services. If you have been exposed to someone who has or who may have Covid-19, please stay at home.
- ✧ Temple Israel of Riverhead reserves the right to deny entrance to anyone who does not comply.

My Jewish Journey and the Nudge of Selichot

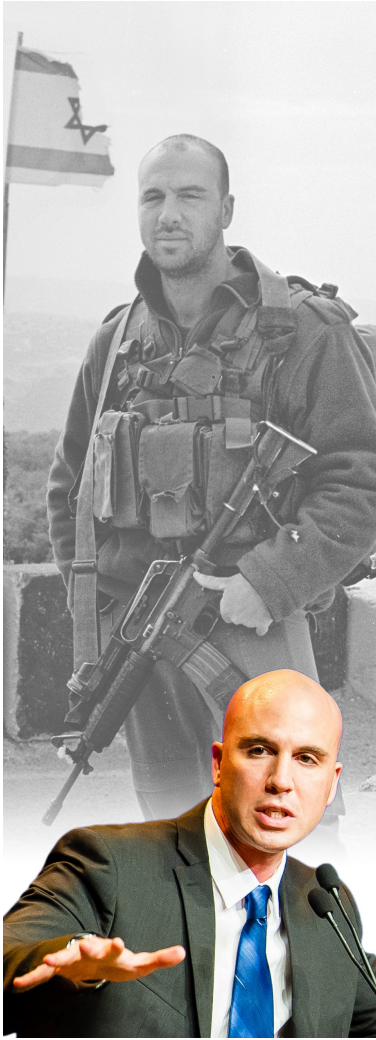

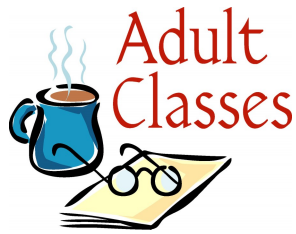

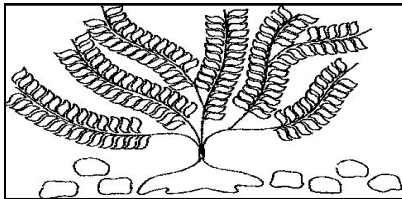
